**Burkhart's Family Show Goats
JPN Livestock
Logan Farm**

RULES:

1. Goats must be dehorned and scurs must be 2" or less. Registered & un-registered Boer breeding, Angora & Pygmy goats **can** have horns.
2. All goat exhibitors will be responsible for making the allotted pen to restrain their goat(s).
3. Dairy goats are to be shown with choker chains. Pygmy goats are to be shown with collars and a short lead. **PINCHER CHAINS OR SPIKED CHAINS ARE ALLOWED.**
4. **All animals MUST have scrapie ID, including wethers. Scrapie check will be at 9:30 AM on Tuesday morning. If chipped or tattooed, someone will need to be present at that time. All scratches will be made at this time.** If scrapie ID is not present on or in the animal, exhibitor will be notified to remove such animal immediately and animal will NOT be re-admitted and will NOT show. Scrapie program needs official letter to verify herd name and number. If animal is chipped, provide documentation and reader.
5. Age of animal is calculated from show date.
6. If an illness is in the barn and a quarantine happens, it will be the owners responsibility to feed, water and bed the animals until released. Owner is responsible for clean pens during and after the quarantine.
7. **All goats claiming to be a specific breed must have a copy of breed registration papers. If you have no registration papers, they will show as utility animals. Registration papers will be due move-in day of the fair. Animals must be checked in before unloading in the barn.**

BOER GOAT SHOW

Judging: Saturday following the Market Show

RULES:

1. An original registration or recordation certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older.
2. There will be no pre-show milk out.
3. A doe may compete only once in the age classes of an individual show.

No bedding shall be laid until AFTER 1 PM on the Sunday before fair. Pen assignments will NOT be hung until after 1 PM. DO NOT move pens without permission from a Fair Board member. NO ONE is to clean and empty stalls until the breed/species has been completed at the Jr. Fair Livestock Sale.

RECOMMENDED BEDDING: Straw, Sawdust, SMALL chips. If large/shredded bark or chips is used, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to remove it by the end of fair (midnight of the last day, unless cleared through board member). Failure to remove bedding (clean pens) will result in forfeiting premiums. Bark is a hazard to those spreading the manure.
